

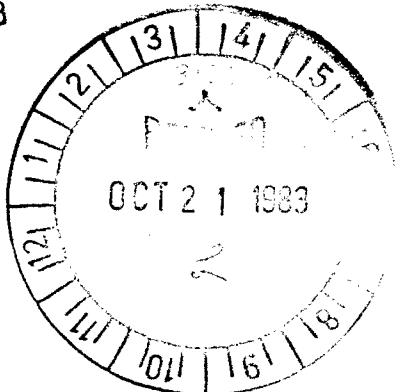

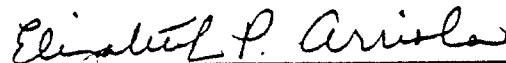

CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

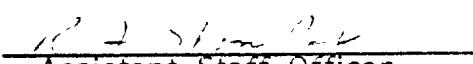
This is to certify that Substitute Bill No. 254, "AN ACT MAKING GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE EXECUTIVE AND JUDICIAL BRANCHES OF GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1984, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES", returned to the Legislature without the approval of the Governor was, in accordance with the Organic Act of Guam, reconsidered by the Legislature and after such reconsideration, the Legislature did, on the 6th day of October 1983, agree to pass said bill notwithstanding the objections of the Governor by a vote of two-thirds of all members thereof, to wit: by a vote of 16 members.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GRENADA,

CHAPTER 1

3 Section 1. Short Title. This Act may be cited as the "General
4 Appropriation Act of 1964." The provisions of Chapter I of this Act
5 shall take effect on October 1, 1963.

Section 2. Estimated Revenues. The Legislature adopts the following as its revenue forecast for Fiscal Year 1984:

Section 3. Definitions. As used in Chapter 1 of the General Appropriations Act of 1984:

(a) "Capital Outlay" includes:

1 (1) equipment such as: loader trucks, tractors, trailers,
2 automobiles or other vehicles; machinery; reference books; filing
3 cabinets, typewriters, adding and calculating machines, other
4 business machines, office equipment; tools, implements and
5 instruments which may be used continuously without material change
6 in physical condition; which have a useful life of one (1) year or
7 longer and cost not less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) but
8 not more than Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000);

9 (2) repair, remodeling or alterations of a building or
10 replacement thereof, the replacement and removal of plumbing, wiring
11 and air conditioning systems costing more than Thirty Thousand
12 Dollars (\$30,000). Capital Outlay does not include normal
13 maintenance expenditures;

14 (3) construction of an entirely new building, including the
15 materials and labor either supplies by an agency of the government
16 or supplied by contract; and

17 (4) non-structural improvements to buildings, the grading,
18 levelling, drainage and landscaping of land or the construction of
19 roadways, fences, ditches, or sanitary or storm sewers.

20 (b) "Contingency" means expenditure for unanticipated items;

21 (c) "Expenditures" means all amounts of money, other than refunds
22 authorized by law, paid out or expended for payment by a
23 territorial agency other than for investment securities or an
24 agent or trustee for other governmental entities or private persons;

25 (d) "FEE" means:

1 (1) the equivalent of one (1) permanent position continuously
2 filled by one (1) person full-time for two thousand eighty (2,080)
3 hours per year for the period to which the General Appropriation
4 Act of 1983 pertains, an FTE position shall not be filled on a
5 part-time basis or on a limited term for less than two thousand
6 eighty (2,080) hours per year. In the event, it is necessary to
7 hire employees on a temporary or part-time basis, not more than one
8 employee shall occupy a FTE position at any given point in time.

9 (2) It shall be a petty misdemeanor for any director, agency
10 head, commanding officer or their designee to knowingly employ a
11 person within the government of Guam to a position described as an
12 FTE position whereby a person is employed for less than two
13 thousand eighty hours (2,080) per year except part-time or temporary
14 term employment as hereinabove authorized or where an expenditure
15 for personnel services exceeds twenty-five percent (25%) for any
16 quarter of the fiscal year.

17 (e) "Federal funds" means payments by the United States Government
18 to the territorial government or territorial agencies for specific
19 purposes or in lieu of taxes, including grants, reimbursements, and
20 payments made in accordance with contracts but does not include
21 payments pursuant to Section 30 of the Organic Act of Guam;

22 (f) "General Fund" means that Fund created by §6209 of the Government
23 Code;

24 (g) "Lease of office space" means payment to a non-governmental
25 entity for rental of office space and may include the cost of
26 maintenance, power, and other utility expenses;

(ii) "Watch" jeans direct cost starting on initial General Fund
summons received with a condition for acceptance for federal funds.

(e) "Operating Expenses" includes:

(1) services rendered or performed by business, other government agencies or individuals other than expenses for personal services;

(2) off-island travel expenses and local mileage reimbursement in accordance with the Government Code;

(3) supplies and materials which by their nature are consumable, which have the useful lifetime of less than one (1) year or of which, after use, undergo an impairment or a material change in physical condition;

(4) current services or charges for rental of personal property, insurance premiums (not employee benefits), dues, paid subscriptions and other fixed charges;

(5) equipment having a purchase price of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) or less; and

(6) telex and other forms of communication except telephone.

(j) "Other Fund" years:

(1) unencumbered balances in territorial agency accounts appropriated by the General Appropriation Act of 1964, and

(2) all revenue available to territorial agencies from sources other than the General Fund and federal funds.

(k) "Personal Services" includes:

(I) salaries and wages payable to persons employed by the Government;

(2) the Government's contributions to the Retirement Fund
and the employer's contribution under the Federal Insurance
Contribution Act; and

(3) the Government's contribution for health, dental and life insurance plans.

(1) "Power" includes all expenses incurred for the use of electricity or natural gas.

(ii) "Revenue" means all amounts received by a territorial agency from sources external to that agency, net of refunds and other correcting transactions, other than the issue of debt liquidation or investment or as agent or trustee for other governmental agents, entities or private persons;

(n) "Telephone" includes all charges for telephone service and charges for long distance calls;

(c) "Territorial Agency" means any office, department, institution, board, bureau, commission, council, authority or committee of territorial government; and

(p) "Water" includes all expenses for the purchase of water and all expenses for wastewater treatment.

Section 4. General Provisions. (a) Amounts set out under the column headings "General Fund" and "Other Fund" are appropriated from the source indicated by the column heading except as otherwise specifically provided in Section 5 of this Chapter. Amounts set out under the column heading "Federal Funds" are appropriated in

they are matching funds but are provided for informational purposes only if they are not matching funds. Amounts designated as "Totals" are provided for informational purposes and are not appropriations.

(b) For Fiscal Year 1984, appropriations are made as set out in Section 5 of Chapter I of the General Appropriation Act of 1984 from the General Fund or Other Funds as indicated to territorial agencies named or for the purposes expressed, or so much thereof as may be necessary, within available revenues and unencumbered balances.

(c) Unencumbered balances in territorial agency accounts remaining at the end of Fiscal Year 1983 from appropriation made from the General Fund shall revert on the last day of the fiscal year to the General Fund, unless otherwise indicated.

(d) The Governor or his official designee shall monitor revenue received by territorial agencies from sources other than the General Fund and shall order reductions in the operating budget of any territorial agency whose revenue from such sources is not meeting budgeted projection.

(e) The total number of FTE authorized for Fiscal Year 1984 is indicated by a number in parenthesis following the line item or subtotal under the column showing the fund source. The total number of FTE shall not be exceeded. To be applied against the total FTE shall be all regular and overtime hours of work performed, hours for which leave is granted and compensation given, except that the number of hours of accrued leave paid upon separation from the Government shall not be applied against the FTE limitation.

(f) The Governor or his official designee shall transmit to the Speaker of the Legislature no later than the seventh day of each month a schedule showing actual cash receipts, actual cash disbursements and encumbrances during the previous month.

(g) Prior to the payment of overtime, a territorial agency shall submit for payroll processing at the end of each pay period a statement as to the amount of overtime due an employee, the purpose for which the employee worked in excess of regular working hours and an explanation and justification as to the need for the overtime.

(ii) Payment for overtime claims shall be prepared only if they are properly documented and, shall be paid to the employee in the employee's next paycheck.

(iii) The Governor or his official designee shall conduct periodic spot audits to determine if employees claiming overtime compensation were on duty at the time such overtime was earned.

(iv) The director or chief officer of the department or agency of the Government upon whose decisions a payment for overtime is authorized shall be personally liable to the Government for any payment of overtime made contrary to the provisions of Paragraph (i) (i) of this Section or for any payment of overtime found to have been made for unauthorized work or no work and, in addition, shall be liable as provided by law for illegal or unauthorized expenditure of government funds.

(h) No more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the appropriations for personnel services may be expended for any quarter of the fiscal year.

1 available locally for expenditures. Effective February 1, 1984, no
2 project shall provide for interim financing or bridge financing through
3 local funds for which federal funding is forthcoming either through one
4 hundred percent (100%) federal financing or matching federal
5 contribution.

6 Section 6. In the hiring of persons for FY 84, those persons laid
7 off from Government of Guam because of lack of federal funding during
8 FY 83 shall be hired first if otherwise qualified. No person hired under
9 these programs shall be subsequently laid off to effectuate this
10 preference.

11 Section 7. The Director of the Department of Administration is
12 authorized to use revenues received for FY 84 from duties and taxes
13 covered into the Treasury of Guam pursuant to Section 30 of the Organic
14 Act of Guam for the payment of the Government of Guam last payroll
15 period in September, 1983.

16 Section 8. No bus shelters in the various villages shall be removed
17 from their present location or relocated without the consent of the
18 Commissioner of the village where such bus shelters are located.

19 No funds for the construction of school bus shelters shall be used
20 unless the design for such bus shelters has been approved by the
21 Legislature.

22 Section 9. No streetlights or portions of streetlights in the various
23 villages shall be removed or disconnected from their present location or
24 relocated without the consent of the commissioner of the village where
25 such streetlights are located.

26 Section 10. For the purposes of controlling and appropriating
27 personnel services lapses accrued during the fiscal year ending
28 September 30, 1984, there is hereby established within the government
29 of Guam a special fund known as the "Personnel Services Lapse Fund".
30 The Personnel Services Lapse Fund shall be under the administration of
31 the Director of Administration; but no monies shall be expended there-
32 from except by appropriation of the Legislature. Within ten (10) days
33 after each pay day period the Director of Administration and the
34 certifying officer of the various departments and agencies within the
35 government of Guam are hereby directed to calculate wage and salary
36 lapses caused by vacant positions and positions for which the present

1 compensation is less than the maximum authorized by the Budget and the
2 fiscal year ending September 30, 1984 and the Director of Administration
3 shall cause to be transferred to the Personnel Services Lapse Fund such
4 amounts as represent vacant positions and positions for which the
5 present compensation is less than the maximum authorized by the Budget
6 for fiscal year ending September 30, 1984. The Personnel Services
7 Lapse Fund shall cease and terminate on September 30, 1984 and monies
8 in said Fund at such time shall be transferred into the General Fund.

9 Section 11. No position created by this Act shall be filled by
10 persons employed through employment contracts or thru special contracts
11 who are hired on island. Whenever it becomes necessary to contract for
12 services from off-island because of recruitment difficulty, and if not
13 otherwise prohibited by other provisions of law or this Act, the employ-
14 ment contract shall be in the same format as the current off-island
15 contract; except that travel expenses shall not be provided and further
16 that recruitment advertising shall not take place without the approval
17 of the Civil Service Commission. Under no circumstances shall positions
18 authorized by this Act be filled by using position titles, pay ranges
19 and/or compensation based on the regular government of Guam wage and
20 classification system. Any person found guilty of violating this provision
21 void the appropriation for the position and no funds
22 shall be expended for the salary of the incumbent of the position.

23 Section 12. No contract shall be entered into for services by a consultant
24 or other person licensed to practice his/her profession. Appropriations for personnel services shall not be made unless such contract shall contain standard employee benefits; further, no such contract shall be entered into unless the contractor is licensed to do business and pay taxes in the United States. The government of Guam shall not pay taxes for the contractor. It is understood that numerous contractors have been paid from appropriation for personnel services. It is the purpose of this provision to stop this practice and to provide the further payment of the Legislatue for personnel services. It is the purpose of this provision to prevent contractors from appropriation intended by the budget.

25 Section 13. No professional or semi-professional and skilled or
26 semi-skilled position created by this Act may be unfilled by

1 persons of less than entry level qualifications in the same position
2 classification. Recruitment in violation of this provision shall void the
3 action and no funds shall be expended for the salary of the incumbent of
4 the position.

5 Section 14. The Department of Administration shall deduct from
6 billings received from the Public Utility Agency of Guam for fire
7 hydrants a unit deduction for defective fire hydrants. The unit deduc-
8 tion shall be calculated by dividing the funds appropriated to the
9 Department of Public Safety for water and sewer by the total number of
10 in-place hydrants.

11 Section 15. Provisional non-professional employees of the Depart-
12 ment of Education who have been occupying permanent positions for at
13 least one hundred eighty (180) days or more prior to the date of this
14 Act, and who have provided satisfactory service during this period,
15 shall be made permanent employees in the classified service of the
16 Department of Education.

17 Section 16. The Department of Education is authorized to identify
18 funds from this year's appropriated budget to provide for reclassification
19 and promotional corrections in the implementation of Public Law 15-138.

20 Section 17. Payment of medical bills by the Department of Public
21 Health and Social Services for the indigent shall not begin prior to
22 December 1, 1983, but may be applied to any covered service rendered
23 during the current fiscal year. The administrative funds, not to exceed
24 ten percent (10%) of the \$2.3 million allotted for that program, shall be
25 immediately available for program planning and development. The initial
26 program shall provide coverage for the same services as in the medicaid
27 Program.

28 Section 18. The Director of Public Health and Social Services shall
29 employ a veterinarian who shall be paid out of the funds appropriated to
30 the Department of Public Health and Social Services by this Act.

31 Section 19. The sum of Five Million Two Hundred Seven Thousand
32 Five Hundred One Dollars (\$5,207,501) is hereby appropriated from the
33 General Fund to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund to provide for
34 the continued implementation of the One Hundred Dollar (\$100) monthly
35 annuity benefits, the Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700) annual supplemental

1 annuity benefits, the Governor's and Lt. Governor's pensions, retirees'
2 group insurance premiums and cost of living allowance.

3 Section 20. Effective January 1, 1984, there is hereby appro-
4 priated the sum of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000) from the General
5 Fund to the office of Cuam's Delegate to Washington for 1984 calendar
6 year.

2 CHAPTER III
3 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

4 Section 1. Section 6254 of the Government Code is amended to read:
5 "Section 6254. Certifying Officers: accountability. (a) The
6 Certifying Officer shall:

7 (1) be held responsible for the existence and correctness of
8 the facts recited on the certificate or otherwise stated on the
9 voucher or its supporting papers and for the legality of the
10 proposed payments under the appropriation or fund involved;

11 (2) be required to give bond in favor of the Government of
12 Guam pursuant to the provisions of Subchapter II of this
13 Chapter;

14 (3) be held accountable for and required to make good to
15 the Government of Guam the amount of any illegal, improper, or
16 incorrect payment resulting from any false, inaccurate, or
17 misleading certificate made by him, as well as for payment
18 prohibited by law which did not represent a legal obligation under
19 the appropriation or fund involved;

20 (4) be held personally liable for any expenditure in excess
21 of an allotment authorized by the Director of the Bureau and
22 Budget and Management Research; and

23 (5) be found guilty of a misdemeanor if he or she has
24 authorized an expenditure of funds in excess of an appropriation.

25 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection (a) of this
26 section, the Attorney General may, at his discretion, relieve such
27 Certifying Officer of liability for any payment otherwise
28 improper whenever he finds:

29 (1) that the certification was based on official records and
30 that such Certifying Officer did not know, and by reasonable
31 diligence and inquiry could not have ascertained the actual facts;
32 or

33 (2) That the obligation was incurred in good faith, that the
34 payment was not contrary to any statutory provision specifically

1 prohibiting payments of the character involved, and that the
2 Government of Guam did receive fair value for such payment.

3 (c) No relief, however, shall be granted by the Attorney
4 General as prescribed under Subsection (b) of this Section from any
5 expenditures in excess of an amount appropriated, or in the absence
6 of an appropriation or in excess of funds available. In such instances,
7 the Attorney General shall proceed to prosecute the Certifying Officer
8 who shall then be deemed to have committed a ~~misdemeanor~~.

9 Section 2. Section 5601 and Section 5602 of the Government Code are
10 hereby repealed and enacted to read:

11 "Section 5601. Office of the Lieutenant Governor - Program
12 Responsibilities. The Office of the Lieutenant Governor shall have
13 program responsibilities including but not limited to the following:

14 (a) The Office of the Lieutenant Governor shall be designated as
15 the clearinghouse for all federal aid programs for Guam. As such, the
16 Lieutenant Governor shall be the liaison between the Executive Branch
17 of the Government of Guam and the Federal Regional Council and
18 Federal agencies. All federal program commitments, state plans and
19 applications must have the initial review of the Bureau of Budget and
20 Management Research prior to their submission to the Lieutenant
21 Governor for final action. The Lieutenant Governor shall submit to
22 the Speaker of the Legislature a list of all federally-aided programs or
23 projects covered in the clearinghouse review process. The Lieutenant
24 Governor shall keep the Speaker of the Legislature informed of the
25 nature of clearinghouse procedures.

26 (b) The Lieutenant Governor shall forward copies of all
27 clearinghouse comments on proposed federally assisted programs and
28 projects, together with descriptions of proposed programs and
29 projects, to the Speaker of the Legislature for purposes of information
30 only and review. The Legislature may reject, by resolution, prior to
31 grant award, a department or agency's participation in a
32 federally-assisted program or project upon determining that such
33 program or project would be adverse to the public interest, or that
34 insufficient funds exist for the local matching contribution.

1 the Legislature of the alternate energy plan to be submitted by the
2 Governor to the Legislature no later than August 1, 1983, as required
3 by Public Law 16-119.

4 (f) Upon the adoption of the alternate energy plan, the
5 Governor or any other officer of the Government of Guam or its
6 agencies shall be required, notwithstanding any other provision of law
7 to the contrary, to solicit bids publicly for the design and
8 construction of the alternate energy production facilities and systems
9 approved by the Legislature in the alternate energy plan."

10 Section 4. Subsection (h) of Section 17202 of the Government Code, as
11 amended in Public Law 15-61, is further amended to read:

12 (h) Accessory buildings or structures may be located and
13 maintained in a rear yard, except in the required ten (10) foot rear
14 yard which is that portion adjoining the rearmost main building on the
15 lot. Such buildings or structures may also be located and maintained
16 in any side yard, except in the required eight (8) foot side yards
17 adjoining each of the side lot lines. When such buildings or
18 structures are to be used exclusively for storage or as outdoor
19 cooking facilities, they may be located in a rear yard with walls
20 erected on the rear and/or side lot lines; provided that such buildings
21 or structures shall not exceed two hundred (200) square feet of floor
22 space and the roofs thereof shall not project beyond the rear or side
23 lot lines and shall be sloped in such a manner as to prevent rain run
24 off from flowing to adjacent property. A storage or cooking facility
25 may only be constructed on residential lots which meet the yard
26 requirements provided by Section 17200 of this Code."

27 Section 5. A new Chapter 66-A is added to 10 GCA to read:

28
29 "Chapter 66-A
30 Neighborhood Patrol

2 excluding Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays, prior to the closing
3 of the registration rolls. Electors may also be registered at such times

6 the employee has received certification by the Director that funds for
7 overtime pay as provided in Subsaction (c) above are available."

10 "Section 82401. Right to Humane Care and Treatment. Every

18 "Section 82402. Mechanical Restraints. Mechanical restraints
19 shall not be applied to a patient unless it is determined by the head of

22 mental health needs of the patient. Every use of a mechanical
23 restraint and the reasons therefor shall be made a part of the clinical
24 record of the patient under the signature of the head of the hospital,

12 the right of communication, every patient shall be entitled to communicate
13 by sealed mail with the Administrator, the Director of the Department of

16 (c) Any limitations imposed by the head of the hospital or the
17 Director of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse on the

2 (3) years; provided that of the members first appointed, two (2) shall
3 serve for one (1) year, two (2) shall serve for two (2) years and

19 effect on February 1, 1983, provided that in such event, the Guam
20 Power Authority shall not charge any consumer the Power Factor
21 Adjustment contained in rates which were in effect on February 1,
22 1983. In such event, the said February 1, 1983, rates shall thereafter
23 remain in full force and effect until amended by law."

GOVERNOR'S TRANSMITTAL FISCAL YEAR 1984 BUDGET

The Governor, on April 15, 1983, transmittal letter accompanying the FY'84 Budget focused in adhering to an austere or "hold the line policy" budget with exceptions in the functional categories of Public Safety and Economic Development. The proposed budget calls for an appropriation of \$166.4 million comprising of \$150.3 million General Fund and \$16.1 million on Federal Grants in Aid for the operation of the three branches of government. The Governor calls on the Legislature to focus its attention on the continuing fiscal deficit presently at a level of \$109 million and his commitment to the elimination of the deficits, as well as the fact that GovGuam is faced with a cash shortage of about \$17 million by the end of FY'83.

According to the Governor, the demand for more public services and facilities cannot be satisfied with our current revenue limitations and calls on the Legislature to provide alternative revenue sources, not only to meet current needs, but also future needs of the island. In addition, the Governor re-emphasized the need to act on his tax proposals.

GOVERNOR'S PROPOSAL - A BALANCED BUDGET - FY 1984

The Governor is presenting a balanced budget request for the operation and expenditure plan in the amount of \$168.4 million match with an equal revenue estimate of \$166.4 million, consisting of

\$150.2 General Fund, and \$16.1 in Federal Grants in Aid (matching) Funds. The Governor is proposing an allocation of the estimate revenues to fund the following:

FEATURES OF THE 1984 BUDGET REQUEST

Governor has described his budget proposal for FY'84 as an austere budget with no capital improvement projects funded by the General Fund. However, the proposal emphasized more attention on crime prevention and economic development and with an apparent under budgeting of certain areas, i.e. Department of Education, University of Guam, Guam Community College, and an increase staffing level request for program areas in the government wide support. While COLA as mandated by P.L. 15-135 and P.L. 16-111, the inclusion of COLA was not uniformly made.

GOVERNOR'S REVENUE FORECAST

The 1984 Executive Budget provides for an estimated \$150,290,000 of the general fund revenues and an additional \$16,119,627 of matching funds provided by Federal Grants-in-aid, for a total of \$166,409,627.

Of this total, the most significant revenue sources are as follows:

As shown above, the first four local revenue sources provide for 86% of the total estimated revenues for 1984.

INCOME TAXES

Individual and corporate income taxes are projected at \$75,400,000. This is approximately \$4.5 million greater than the amount estimated for 1983, \$1.5 million greater than the actual amount received in 1982 and \$5.8 million and \$12.4 million, respectively, greater than the actual amounts for 1981 and 1980.

BBMR projected this amount using a least squares linear regression with data inputs for actual revenues from 1979, 1980, 1981, and 1982, and revised estimated revenues for 1983. After factoring in the tax cuts provided for in the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 (ERTA), this method resulted in an estimate of \$69.4 million which was adjusted upward to \$70.4 million based on an apparent management decision.

In addition, through information provided by the Department of Revenue and Taxation, the \$70.4 million was again revised upward to \$75.4 million, based on the assumption that approximately \$5 million of prior years' income tax receivable accounts will be collected in fiscal year 1984.

GROSS RECEIPTS TAX (GRT)

Gross receipts tax revenues for 1984 are estimated at \$40 million. Once again a linear regression was used in making this projection. While actual GRT revenues for fiscal years 1979 through 1982 were used as inputs in this regression, an estimate of \$40 million was used for fiscal year 1983.

This \$40 million, coincidental in amount to the \$40 million projected for 1984, is questionable in that it was itself the product of a linear regression. A revenue statement from the Department of Administration reflects cumulative GRT revenues of \$27.4 million for the ten months ended July 31, 1982. If annualized, this would result in a 1983 GRT revenue figure of approximately \$32.9 million. This annualized figure is very close to the official 1983 GRT revenue estimate of \$33.27 million.

Accordingly, if a figure of \$33 million were factored into the linear regression for 1983 in place of the \$40 million figure used by BBMR, the resulting GRT revenue estimate for 1984 would be \$38.4 million, or \$1.6 million less than the amount reflected in the Executive Budget.

In defense of the estimate of \$40 million for 1984, BBMR has cited several valid factors which would, in effect, result in revenues of this magnitude. Such factors include increased construction, for which several specific projects were listed, and a general upturn in the economy.

SECTION 30 FUNDS

The estimate of Section 30 funds to be received in 1984 remains unchanged from the 1983 estimate of \$23 million. The \$23 million for 1984 was also derived through a linear regression. After adjustment for the impact of ERTA, the original estimate of \$23.143 million was changed to \$20.829 million. This figure was then adjusted upward to \$23 million based on a discretionary judgement made by BBMR.

This judgement was based principally upon two factors:

1. Home porting of the U.S.S. Niagara in Guam.
2. Recovery of Section 30 funds for non-military Federal employees stationed in Guam currently and in several prior years.

REAL PROPERTY TAX (RPT)

The estimate for 1984 RPT revenues is \$4.815 million. As is the case with the other revenue estimate discussed above, this projection is the result of a linear regression. The original regression resulted in a projection of nearly \$5.6 million. However, at its discretion, BBMR adjusted this figure downward to \$4.815 million. This figure compares favorable to the figure which results from the annualization of the actual cumulative RPT revenues for the 10 months ended July 31, 1983.

CASH MANAGEMENT PROBLEMS WITHIN THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM

GovGuam base its funding plan on estimated revenues under the accrued accounting principle and expenditures plan through the appropriation process monitored by the allotment methods to authorize incurring of obligation. This system has operated quite efficiently and effectively as long as the cash flow of the Government of Guam exceeds authorized spending level. During FY'82, a total of \$216,198,809 representing actual cash receipts with a cash disbursement of \$150,924,794, giving the Government an apparent excess of cash in the amount of \$65,274,015. For FY'83, the total cash receipts were approximately \$220,746,291 with disbursements of \$183,550,122 with an apparent cash windfall of \$37,196,169. If these figures as recorded in the government records are true and substantially factual and supportable records, why then did we have a cash shortfall as predicted by the Administration in the last eight months? In comparing the government's cash flow between two fiscal years, an overall decrease of total cash receipts of over 3% occurred, excluding the \$10 million bank loan, or approximately, \$5,452,518 less received in 1983 than in 1982. With respect to the disbursement, there was an increase in the disbursement by over 18% or approximately \$32,625,328.

In FY'83, a grand total of \$37,866,539 were received from the Federal government, both in the form of matching and/or 100% grant. Federal government policy in remitting grants to local government

is a policy of reimbursement. Government of Guam, under this policy must expend its own cash resources on a federally funded work project and then, request reimbursements at a rate between a minimum of 7 days to at least 90 days or more to receive the cash reimbursement. During FY'82, this was not a problem, inasmuch as GovGuam had a positive net cash flow in excess of \$65 million, enough to finance a "Bridge Financing" or to sustain a federal reimbursement requirement in excess of \$37 million. However, in FY'83, the actual cash disbursement rate increased by 18%, the reasons for such an increase are well known to us, while the actual cash receipt decreased by 3%.

In addition, subsidies to autonomous and non-autonomous agencies in 1983 were approximately \$22,300,000. Under current allotment procedure, the total appropriation subsidies less 10% reserve are allotted quarterly with little, if any, reference given to the receiving agencies immediate actual cash requirements, resulting in the accumulation of a positive cash reserve at the departments' coffers.

During these intermittent months of 1983, a cash shortfall exist. According to the latest financial reports issued by the Department of Administration, the "Due From Federal Government" account averages in excess of \$4 million per month representing a serious drain in the available cash resources resulting in the need for an infusion of cash of at least \$25 million, which has been partially met by a bank loan of \$10 million to be on par comparable rate of disbursement during FY'82.

Administration suggested solution is for a tax proposal to supplement its working capital. GovGuam operation during the last two fiscal years, are basically at a stand still, except for the extraordinary surge to disburse at a rate higher than the 1982 rate during the first few months of FY'83. Thus, the current cash crisis.

It is the Committee's opinion that the cash shortfall could be resolved by:

- 1) Intensify cash collection of all account receivables, (which the Director of Revenue & Taxation is now actively pursuing);
- 2) Request federal government to provide actual cash "up front" before any federal funded projects can commence;
- 3) Re-establish the single letter of credit with the Federal government;
- 4) Consider a small or modified tax increase;
- 5) Adopt an operating budget plan based on the projected cash collection only for the fiscal year period, and is not to include accrued revenue, such as the recognition of receivables for that period; and
6. Adopt an allotment system based on anticipated cash receipts before payment is to be made.

COMMITTEE'S POSITION

The various Sub-committees on Ways & Means Committee conducted public hearings into various program areas and recommended an over-all budget requirements of:

Based on the premises, the Government must operate within its financial resources, the Committee, in its attempt to present a balanced budget, adopts the following parameters:

- (1) In program areas where the Sub-committee recommended a lesser amount than the Governor's proposals, the Sub-committee's recommendations will be accepted;
- (2) In program areas where the Sub-committee's recommended a larger amount than the Governor's proposals, the Governor's proposal will be accepted;
- (3) Reduce funding for current vacancies by 75%;
- (4) Reduce funding for supplies by 25%;
- (5) Reduce funding for equipment by 50%; and

(6) Disallow funding for new positions.

In keeping with a time-honored tradition, and at the recommendation of the Speaker, the Committee recommends the adoption of the Governor's proposals for the Governor's Office and the Lieutenant Governor, without any reductions. The only apparent change is an organizational, recommending the funding for the RSVP transferred to the Department of Public Health and Social Services and restoration of the Veterans Affairs Office.

Based on the above parameters, the Committee recommends Substitute Bill 254 as a balanced budget operating plan for 1984 for passage.
