


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 19655 OF
THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO
CREATION AND USE OF THE TOURIST ATTRACTION
FUND, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2 Section 1. Section 19655 of the Government Code of Guam is repealed
3 and reenacted to read:
4 "Section 19655. Creation of Tourist Attraction Fund. There is
5 hereby created, separate and apart from other funds of the
6 Government of Guam, a fund known as the 'Tourist Attraction Fund'
7 This Fund shall not be commingled with the General Fund and shall be
8 kept in a separate bank account. All proceeds from taxes collected
9 under this chapter shall be deposited in the Tourist Attraction Fund
10 and shall be expended for improving the physical facilities of public
11 parks and recreation areas and for activities of the Guam Visitors
12 Bureau as authorized in 9 GCA §§9107 and 9113. The Tourist
13 Attraction Fund may also be used to fund the following projects:

- 1 (a) the creation, improvement or beautification of roads,
2 avenues, boulevards, parkways, intersections, bicycle paths,
3 motor bike trails, footpaths, biking trails, stairways, rivers,
4 streams, estuaries, lagoons, or other means of access and
5 transportation;
6 (b) the development and restoration of points of natural beauty
7 or historic social or cultural significance, including means of
8 access, parking, safety devices, concessions, restrooms, view
9 points and information pavilions;
10 (c) the construction of monuments, memorials, statues,
11 fountains, arches, and similar projects;
12 (d) the construction of buildings to be used for public purposes
13 including zoos and aquariums, museums, athletic facilities,
14 cultural centers, and performing arts complexes;
15 (e) landscaping, provision of decorations or the enhancement of
16 beauty of any of the projects listed in this section;
17 (f) accessory projects reasonably necessary to projects listed in
18 this section;
19 (g) certain projects and programs identified in the Tumon Bay
20 Master Plan.

21 All expenditures of the Tourist Attraction Fund shall be by
22 appropriation by the Legislature."

23 Section 2. 4 GCA §6213.1 is added to read:

24 "Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the
25 Governor may authorize, upon a certification of need from the Director
26 of the hiring agency, the inclusion of return transportation benefits as
27 part of an off-island employment contract; however, no person shall be
28 granted more than one (1) contract providing transportation benefits
29 of any kind unless there has been a lapse of at least one (1) year
30 since the expiration of the prior contract."

1 Section 3. No proceeds from taxes collected pursuant to Chapter VIII
2 of Title XX of the Government Code prior to the date of enactment of this
3 Act shall be considered an obligation on the part of the General Fund
4 towards the "Tourist Attraction Fund" created by this Act.

5 Section 4. Section 11955 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby
6 amended as follows:

7 "Section 11955. Timetable. (a) By September 30, 1983 the
8 Chamorro Language Commission shall prepare a Chamorro Orthography
9 and shall conduct a public hearing in Guam at least once in each of
10 the four (4) legislative district for the purpose of receiving comments
11 and suggestions on the proposed orthography. such Chamorro
12 Language Orthography shall be available for public inspection at last
13 ten (10) days prior to the scheduled public hearing. The date and
14 subject matter of the scheduled public hearing shall be published in a
15 newspaper of general circulation in Guam for three (3) consecutive
16 days at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled public hearing.

17 (b) The Commission shall consult with government leaders and
18 other in the Common Wealth of the Northern Mariana Islands who are
19 interested in the standardization of the Chamorro Language
20 Orthography and pursue ways by which agreement can be reached.

21 (c) When a final version has been developed, the Commission,
22 adhering to the Administrative Adjudication Law, shall adopt such
23 Chamorro Language Orthography.

24 (d) The Chamorro Language Orthography shall be made official
25 upon its adoption by the Commission, unless the Legislature by June
26 30, 1985, rescinds by resolution the action of the Commission."
