- (a) The Guam Community College is the designated custodian of all funds received by the government of Guam from the federal government for programs administered by the Guam Community College, *except* for funds awarded to the Guam Community College received via sub-grants within Title V through the Guam Department of Education. The Board of Trustees is authorized and directed to receive and provide for the proper custody of the funds, and to make disbursement thereof in the manner provided in the federal acts which govern the expenditure of the funds.
- (b) The Board of Trustees is authorized to establish a public not for profit corporation that *shall* be separate and apart from the government of Guam and the Guam Community College for the purpose of being able to accept private gifts, donations, endowments, grants, and other monies which may be offered to the Guam Community College. Such gifts, donations,

## § 32101. Organization Structure.

The Board of Trustees is authorized to determine the College's organizational structure and the composition of divisions of programs as it deems appropriate to achieve its mission as outlined within Division 4 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated.

## § 32102. Post-Secondary and Continuing Education.

The Board of Trustees *shall* offer career and technical education programs through post-secondary programs and continuing education courses. The programs may be either credit or non-credit, and may be degree or non-degree programs.

# § 32103. Apprenticeship Training.

The Board of Trustees *shall* consider problems of developing local skills in the various crafts and trades and developing a program of apprenticeship training and apprenticeship standards in accordance with standards established by and acceptable for registration with the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, United States Department of Labor or its successor.

The Board *shall*, in cooperation with an appropriate advisory committee composed of members of the construction industry, general business community, labor community, the general public and the Department of Education, formulate an apprenticeship program in the several career and technical fields in which critical shortages of trained personnel exist.

# § 32104. Cooperative Programs Authorized.

The College is authorized to enter into contracts with public or private organizations, firms, companies or individuals to provide technical manpower training and testing programs. Such contracts *shall* be utilized to

provide for specialized training and testing in particular fields *not* otherwise available within the College which are designed to train or test local persons in needed skills and at the same time to train employees to carry on such courses.

Any contract under this Section may require the training of College employees to continue teaching such a course on a self-sustaining basis after the initial contract period which *shall not* be in excess of three (3) years."

**Section 15.** §33104 of Chapter 33, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *repealed*.

Section 16. The Compiler of Laws *shall* move Article 3 of Chapter 32, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, titled: "Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission" to Division 5 of Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, and renumber accordingly.

**Section 17.** A new §33105 is hereby *added* to Chapter 33, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

# "§ 33105. Procurement Authority.

The College is authorized to promulgate its own services, supplies, and construction procurement regulations pursuant to Title 5 GCA, §§ 5125, 5131, 5030 (k) and (q), 5120, 5302(b) and (c), 5304(b), 5306(d), and 5307.

The procurement laws and regulations established in Guam's Procurement law, found in Title 5 GCA, Chapter 5, and 2 G.A.R. Division 4 *shall* be used by GCC in the procurement of all services, supplies, and construction procurement contracts. The College will use the laws and regulations established in Title 5 GCA, Chapter 5, and 2 G.A.R. Division 4 as its own regulations unless and until the Board of Trustees approves different or additional procurement regulations.

The College will employ its own Chief Procurement Officer, who will 1 2 serve as the procurement officer for all supplies, services, and construction 3 contracts for the College. The College may, upon the Board of Trustee's approval, delegate its 4 5 procurement authority of construction contracts to the Department of Public 6 Works. The College may, upon the Board of Trustee's approval, delegate its 7 8 procurement authority of services and supplies contracts to the General 9 Service Agency." Section 18. A new §33106 is hereby added to Chapter 33, Title 17, Guam 10 11 Code Annotated, to read: Authorization of the College to enter into a renewable 12 **"§ 33106.** lease agreement with Guam Power Authority in order to develop educational 13 opportunities to train workers for the emerging technologies related to 14 15 sustainable and renewable energy. *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature) hereby grants the College, 16 (a) pursuant to Title 1 GCA, §1800, the authority to enter into this lease 17 agreement with GPA. 18 19 *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature) hereby grants the College, 20 pursuant to Title 21 GCA, §60112, the authority for the College to 21 enter into this lease agreement with GPA. 22 (c) *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature) hereby grants the College, pursuant to Title 2 GCA, §2107, an exception for the College to enter 23 into this lease agreement with GPA, without requiring a separate piece 24 of legislation. 25 (d) I Liheslatura (the Legislature) intends for this statute to 26

#### COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

#### I. OVERVIEW

#### Appearing before the Committee

Dr. Mary A. Y. Okada, President of the Guam Community College

- Vice Speaker B.J. Cruz stated that he would like to review the proposed procurement amendment, before he commits to it and he asked to provide an explanation for the amendment.
- Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. stated that she intended to introduce a substitute bill to replace the original bill which would have included the procurement process, but a hearing date was set for the bill and to prevent further delay of the bill being heard, she recommended to President Okada that she provide testimony to include the amendments on to the bill.
- **Dr. Mary Okada** responded that currently GCC has implicit authority regarding procurement; however in recent months there have been issues with some of the bids. She stated that GCC was asked to identify where in the GCC legislation that GCC has the authority to procure. She stated that they have been following the same government of Guam and GSA procurement rules, GCC has hired a procurement chief procurement officer and supply administrator. She stated that at one point GCC had to get documentation from the Department of Public Works that GCC can enter into construction contracts, because it is not in GCC enabling legislation, but she explained that GCC has been doing this for years. She made it clear that this legislation is just to validate its authority; GCC does not intend to create its own procurement law or anything separate from the Guam Code Annotated. She ended by stating that it is just specifically give us the authority to procure.
- Vice Chairman v.c. pangelinan asked Dr. Okada why is there a need to form the GCC foundation separate from the endowment fund.
- **Dr. Mary Okada** replied that the GCC foundation already exists it has bylaws and charter, but the law does not say that, the foundation was created by a policy by the board. She elaborated that the proposed legislation would create it as a separate entity not under the authority of the board of trustees.
- Senator Sam Mabini, Ph.D. asked Dr. Okada specifically about manpower training section 32-104, if an amendment would improve the bill authorizing GCC to enter into a contract for testing programs.
- **Dr. Mary Okada** responded that the College currently enters into contracts with private and public organizations and so there are different kinds of training. This specifically identifies the workforce development component that the college offers through continuing education or through apprenticeship programs
- Senator Sam Mabini, Ph.D. asked Dr. Okada if there is no need to include testing programs.
- Dr. Mary Okada replied we can include it.

There being no further comments or questions for Dr. Mary Okada on Bill No. 176-31 (LS), Speaker Won Pat concluded the hearing on the bill.

#### III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Education and Public Libraries finds that the testimony presented by Dr. Okada requesting to add §33105 and §33106 to Chapter 33 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated as amendments to Bill No. 176-31 (LS) is satisfactory, given that the Guam Community College has been managing its procurement by implicit authority for many years.

The Board shall, in cooperation with an appropriate advisory committee composed of members of the construction industry, general business community, labor community, the general public and the Department of Education formulate an apprenticeship program in the several vocational-technical career and technical fields in which critical shortages of trained personnel exist.

## § 32104. Cooperative Programs Authorized.

The College is authorized to enter into contracts with public or private organizations, firms, companies or individuals to provide technical manpower training and testing programs. Such contracts shall be utilized to provide for specialized training and testing in particular fields not otherwise available within the College which are designed to train or test local persons in needed skills and at the same time to train employees to carry on such courses.

Any contract under this Section may require the training of College employees to continue teaching such a course on a self-sustaining basis after the initial contract period which shall not be in excess of three (3) years."

**Section 15.** §33104 of Chapter 33 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *repealed*.

**Section 16.** The Compiler of Laws shall move Article 3 of Chapter 32 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated titled "Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission" to Division 5 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated and renumber accordingly.

**Section 17.** §33105 of Chapter 33 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *added* to read:

## § 33105. Procurement Authority.

The College is authorized to promulgate its own services, supplies, and construction procurement regulations pursuant to 5 G.C.A. §§ 5125, 5131, 5030 (k) and (q), 5120, 5302(b) and (c), 5304(b), 5306(d), and 5307.

The procurement laws and regulations established in Guam's Procurement law, found in 5 G.C.A. Chapter 5, and 2 G.A.R. Division 4 shall be used by GCC in the procurement of all services, supplies, and construction procurement contracts. The College will use the laws and regulations established in 5 G.C.A. Chapter 5 and 2 G.A.R. Division 4 as its own regulations unless and until the Board of Trustees approves different or additional procurement regulations.

The College will employ its own Chief Procurement Officer, who will serve as the procurement officer for all supplies, services, and construction contracts for the College.

The College may, upon the Board of Trustee's approval, delegate it's procurement authority of construction contracts to the Department of Public Works.

The College may, upon the Board of Trustee's approval, delegate it's procurement authority of services and supplies contracts to the General Service Agency.

Honorable Speaker Won Pat and Committee Members,

I would like to thank you for the opportunity to come before you today to present my testimony in support of Bill No. 176-31, relative to the Guam Community College.

Guam Community College is a multi-faceted public vocational educational institution, created by the Community College Act of 1977 to strengthen and consolidate what was previously known as vocational education on Guam. The College operates secondary and postsecondary vocational programs, adult and continuing education, community education, and short-term specialized training, as dictated by community and industry needs. Our programs are delivered both on and off-campus, in satellite programs and on site at businesses as needed. We offer over 50 programs of study, and prepare our students for entry-level employment in career and technical fields or transfer to four-year institutions of higher education.

GCC also offers a variety of community service and special programs to prepare students for Testimony college experiences including English as a Second Language, Adult Basic Education, General Education Development (GED) preparation and testing, and an Adult High School Diploma program.

The reason we are proposing the changes to the Guam Community College Act of 1977 is that in the language of the reauthorized Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Technical Act of 2006, the phrase "career and technical education" (CTE) was substituted for "vocational education" throughout the document. Even earlier, in 1998, the American Vocational Association became the Association for Career and Technical Education (ACTE) and members encouraged organizations and agencies to remove "vocational education" from documents and legislation and replace it with "career and technical education." Similarly, in Fall 2000, The Journal of Vocational and Technical Education changed its name to The Journal of Career and Technical Education.

In keeping with this change in language, GCC is now currently working to make this change in its internal documents.

The proposed changes outlined in Bill 176-31 correspond to the nationally encouraged and recognized adoption of the phrase "career and technical education" with regard to encompassing legislation. This legislation will transition the discussion of career preparation in educational institutions in order to merge the two previously traditional separate pathway ideas of either a higher education track or a CTE track into one unified career track, because both the education and business worlds now realize that the two cannot be separated: students need both education and skill sets in order to succeed in life.

In addition, this legislation also provides GCC with procurement and leasing capabilities not previously granted in the original enabling legislation.

The legislation specifically authorizes its procurement authority for services, supplies, and construction contracts, pursuant to Guam Code Annotated.

This legislation also authorizes the College to enter into a renewable lease agreement with Guam Power Authority in order to develop educational opportunities to train workers for the emerging technologies related to sustainable and renewable energy, without requiring a separate piece of legislation.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify today. I will be happy to answer any questions you may have about the proposed changes to our enabling legislation at this time.

- (3) to establish and maintain short-term extension and apprenticeship training programs in Guam;
- (4) to expand and maintain secondary and post-secondary educational programs in the <del>vocational-technical</del> career and <u>technical</u> fields;
- (5) to award appropriate certificates, degrees and diplomas to qualified students; and
- (6) to serve as the <u>State Agency and the</u> Board of Control for Vocational Education for purposes of the United States Vocational Education Act of 1946 and 1963 and subsequent amendments thereto. The government of Guam hereby accepts together with the benefits of funds appropriated there under the Vocational Education Act of 1946 and any act or acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto as enacted by the Congress of the United States. The Board shall serve as the Board of Control for

1	Vocational Education in the same manner as the Board-of
2	Education previously-served as such Board-of-Control."

## "§ 31111. Custody of Federal Funds; Expenditures.

- (a) The <u>Treasurer of Guam Guam Community College</u> is designated custodian of all funds received by the government of Guam from the Federal Government for programs administered by the Guam Community <u>College</u>, except for funds awarded to the <u>Guam Community College</u> received via sub-grants within Title V through the <u>Guam Department of Education</u>. The <u>Treasurer Board of Trustees</u> is authorized and directed to receive and provide for the proper custody of the funds and to make disbursement thereof <del>upon the order of the Board</del> in the manner provided in the federal acts which govern the expenditure of the funds.
- (b) The Board is authorized to accept private gifts, donations, endowments, grants and other money which may be offered to the Guam Community College; even though such gifts, donations, endowments or grants may be subject to reasonable conditions. Such funds as are received shall be deposited into the fund to be known as the "Guam Community College Fund." Expenditures shall be made from the fund in accordance with such conditions as may be attached to the gift, donation, endowment or grants. Funds appropriated by the government of Guam to the College shall be deposited in the Guam Community College Fund. All tuition payments, fees and all other revenue generated by the College shall be deposited in the Guam Community College Fund.

(b) The Board of Trustees is authorized to establish a public not for
profit corporation that shall be separate and apart from the Government
of Guam and the Guam Community College for the purpose of being
able to accept private gifts, donations, endowments, grants and other
money which may be offered to the Guam Community College. Such
gifts, donations, endowments or grants, supra, shall be in accordance
with the laws of Guam and subject to reasonable conditions. Such funds
received shall be deposited into a fund controlled by the corporation,
supra, and shall be known as the "Guam Community College
Foundation".

Expenditures from the fund shall be made in accordance with such conditions as may be attached to the gift, donation, endowment or grants.

- (c) Expenditure from the Guam Community College-Fund-shall-be made-upon-resolution of the Board."

## "§ 31112. Non-appropriated Funds.

Notwithstanding the provisions of "5162 and 5163 of the Government Code (as enacted in Part V, Section 6 of P.L. No. 15-48), the Guam Community College is authorized to use all <u>revenues</u>, to include <u>tuition payments and fees</u>, derived from its own sources, upon

students a high-school diploma and such other certificates as shall be

The high school shall permit cross-enrollment of students among the several public and private high schools within the Territory.

The chief of the secondary division shall be designated the principal of the Guam-Vocational Technical High-School.

## § 32101. Organization Structure.

The Board of Trustees is authorized to determine the College's organizational structure and the composition of divisions of programs as it deems appropriate to achieve its mission as outlined within Division 4 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated.

## § 32102. Post-Secondary and Continuing Education.

The Post-Secondary and Continuing Education Division shall offer such vocational—technical—and—career—programs—as—the—Board—shall determine. The Board of Trustees shall offer career and technical education programs through post-secondary programs and continuing education courses. The programs may be either credit or non-credit and may be degree or non-degree programs.

## § 32103. Apprenticeship Training Division.

The <u>division Board of Trustees</u> shall consider problems of developing local skills in the various crafts and trades and developing a

program of apprenticeship training and apprenticeship standards in accordance with standards established by and acceptable for registration with the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, United States Department of Labor or its successor.

The Board shall, in cooperation with an appropriate advisory committee composed of members of the construction industry, general business community, labor community, the general public and the Department of Education formulate an apprenticeship program in the several vocational-technical career and technical fields in which critical shortages of trained personnel exist.

## § 32104. Cooperative Programs Authorized.

The College is authorized to enter into contracts with public or private organizations, firms, companies or individuals to provide technical manpower training programs. Such contracts shall be utilized to provide for specialized training in particular fields not otherwise available within the College which are designed to train local persons in needed skills and at the same time to train employees to carry on such courses.

Any contract under this Section may require the training of College employees to continue teaching such a course on a self-sustaining basis after the initial contract period which shall not be in excess of three (3) years."
